














## Happy Hour at Macado's, Salem, March 21st

























## Copper Mountain Colarado, February 12th - 18th

#### Whitefish Montana Feb 27th - March 3rd Schweitzer Idaho March 3rd - March 10th

#### Something a little different and much enjoyed!

Two unique and rewarding Ski Trips. The travel details for the northern Montana and Idaho trips were challenging and many sleepless night were spent managing the 3 different airlines, and 8 separate flights, but it was absolutely worth the extra effort.

Whitefish Mountain hosted 38 RSAC skiers who were awestruck by the spectacular snow ghosts. Snow Ghosts are a natural phenomenon, special to Northwest Montana. While they look soft and ghost-like, they are actually made up of ice, called rime, which is formed from fog that settles on the trees. Truly remarkable.

In addition to the ghost parties going on outside, the club enjoyed many indoor après events and gatherings. We started the week with a yummy and warm Welcome Dinner of fried chicken with all the accompaniments. We shared a special Happy Hour on Monday at The Hellroaring Saloon, a historic chalet on mountain, one of the coolest ski bars in North America. On Wednesday afternoon, 22 members toured Glacier National Park and Hungry Horse Damn by private shuttle. Hungry Horse is one of the largest concrete arch dams in the United States, and its morning-glory spillway, with water cascading over the rim and dropping 490 feet, is the highest in the world. Of course, all the exciting travel and sightseeing excursions made us thirsty, so a private tour and tasting at Glacier Distillery's Whiskey Barn, specializing in small-batch whiskeys and spirits, was the perfect way to end the day. We celebrated the end of the week and the beginning of the next adventure with a pizza and salad party that all members enjoyed, hosted in one of the luxury condos.

Twenty skiers travelled by private coach across Northern Montana, apx 60 miles from the Canadian border, where we were joined by 10 new skiers for a week in Idaho. Schweitzer Resort did not disappoint with its beautiful landscape of incredible giant cedar trees.
