

Winter Park, Colarado, January 27th - February 3rd.

Twenty-Seven RSAC club members participated in our week-long Winter Park ski trip that began on January 27th. Our flights to Denver went smoothly. However, on our arrival at the Zephyr Mountain Lodge Bruce Prillaman took a tumble coming out of the bus and landed on his head. This required Bruce to receive immediate emergency care treatment and reluctantly take a trip back to a Denver hospital for testing and observation. Bruce maintained his sense of humor throughout the experience and thankfully was cleared to be released from the hospital on Sunday. He was back skiing with us on Monday. We were fortunate to have Al Durham on the trip with us as he was able to provide medical assistance and direction to us and Bruce before emergency responders arrived. I was glad to discover that Bruce had trip insurance for the trip which will help to substantially reduce his out-of-pocket costs for his medical bills.

The Zephyr Mountain Lodge featured terrific condo accommodations with a short walk to the gondola. While we did not receive any new snow during our trip, we were treated to 5 consecutive sunny, windless, comfortable blue bird days of skiing. Thankfully, Winter Park had received significant snowstorms before our arrival, so the slopes were in great skiing shape. Day 6 was predominately cloudy with a little light snow. We left for our trip back to Denver on Saturday morning in a pretty significant snowstorm. We arrived back at the airport safely without incident. Through our ski trips out west, I have learned that the bus drivers there are quite adept at driving through significant snow events. Winter Park is a terrific ski destination that truly has a wide very of skiing options for all levels of skier along with scenic views of the continental divide.

No RSAC ski trip would be complete without the opportunity to socialize with our fellow skiers after a day on the slopes. We enjoyed happy hours with appetizers and drinks on Sunday, Monday, and Thursday and ended the trip with the traditional Friday night pizza and clear out your condo refrigerator party. We also ventured into town on Wednesday evening for a pay on your own dinner at Fontenot's Restaurant. The food was exceptionally good, and the staff did a great job servicing our group. There was plenty of food and good times at each event.




